### THT Summer Fair 2025 Post Write Up Part 1

*The great british weather threatened rain but that didn't stop us, Tower Hamlets Together Summer Fair went ahead!*

The Tower Hamlets Together Partnership (THT) was delighted to present its 4<sup>th</sup> 'market styled' Summer Fair on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> July 2025 at Mile End Hospital Gardens.

Local health and care providers from across the THT partnership were invited to host a stall to promote their services. In total, 47 services were present on the day with a further 5 services handing out leaflets. Although the nature of the event did not allow for attendance registration to be taken, guestimate based on food and merchandise provision indicates between 550 – 600 people have taken part including the service stall holders. It was also evident that amongst the attendees were some service users.

The THT Summer Fair is an invaluable way for colleagues to connect across Tower Hamlets. Attendees reported how great it was to be able catch up with colleagues they'd not seen for a while as well as interacting with services that they didn't know existed.

By 13:00 the garden area at Mile End Hospital was buzzing! All eyes were on the skies on a rather warm but cloudy day which did produce a light tinkling of rain, but that didn't stop attendees or stall holders from arriving, giving the event a real feel good vibe.









Attendees were able to enjoy a light vegetarian lunch on presenting their eventbrite ticket as well as a selection of fruits to enjoy!





At around 14:00 'Young Barts at Mile End Hospital' were announced as 'best stall' hitting high scores on all of the criteria including *Theme/Originality*, *Interactive games* and *Friendly and knowledgeable exhibitors* and were presented with a hamper. Runners up were Tower Hamlets Recovery College, Bromley By Bow Health Centre and GP Care Group.

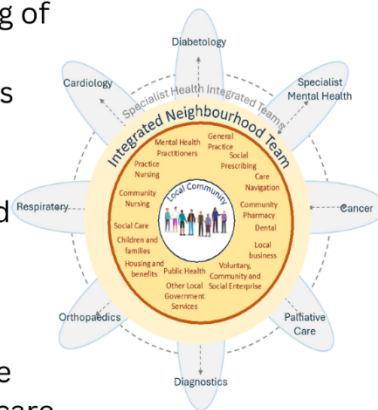
## Integrated Neighbourhood Teams
